

Audit questions Ros Clarke mentions in her talk - 5 Oct 2017

(from Ros: It should be noted that the survey was specifically aimed at evangelical Anglican churches in the UK. Responses from other churches were removed.)

Q1 What is the name (and location) of your church? This will help me remove duplicate answers.

Q2 Would you describe your church as complementarian or egalitarian on the issue of women in ministry? Egalitarians believe that it is appropriate for women to minister in any role in the church; complementarians believe that women and men have different roles in the church.

Q3 How many people are on your church staff team? Please include paid staff (full or part time) and NSM ministers, but not volunteers.

Q4 Of that staff team, how many are women?

Q5 Thinking about the women on your staff team, how many of them are employed to do some kind of Bible teaching or pastoral ministry?

Q6 Thinking about the women on your staff team who are employed to do some Bible teaching or pastoral ministry, what (if any) formal training have they had? Please indicate the 'highest' level of training for each woman staff member. E.g. Children's worker (Ministry training course); Assistant Minister (3 years at theological college); Pastoral worker (1 year Cornhill).

Q7 The last two questions refer to all the women in your church, not just the staff team. What opportunities (if any) does your church offer for women with Bible teaching and pastoral gifts to use these gifts for the good of the church?

Q8 What opportunities (if any) does your church offer for women with Bible teaching and pastoral gifts to receive training in these areas?
